Rotary's emblem originated in 1905 as a simple wagon wheel representing "civilization and movement". The cogged version was made official by a 1919-1920 Board decision. A keyway was added in 1929 to signify that the wheel is a "worker" - not an "idler". (Source: R.I. Information Bulletin, July, 1983).
