PROGRAM

Lynn W. Eley, Mayor of Mequon, addressed the club. He pointed out the cooperation and good relationship which existed with Thiensville, and expressed his appreciation. He then discussed a number of projects which Mequon has going or has just completed. They are:

1. The Solar Heights sewer project, probably the largest in Mequon history, which includes over 300 homes.
2. Building a new Public Safety Building on the corner of Mequon Rd. and Buntrock Ave. Construction is to start near the end of June and is expected to be done next June.
3. The remodeling and repair of the Mequon pool has been completed. It will be open June 10.
4. Remodeling and enlarging the maintenance garage has been completed.
5. Plans are under way to sink a test well in the Virmond Park area. The city is looking ahead to long term needs for water.
6. The Mequon dump has been closed, but this has to be done in accordance with state standards.
7. Recycling services for Mequon (branches, glass, paper, metals, etc.) is being expanded.
8. Concerns about charges from the Metropolitan Sewer Commission still loom high in priority.
9. We are in an extremely productive period in Mequon history (healthy attitude, good council, good administrators).
