Rotary Foundation's 3-H programs:

1. Rotary's goal is to eliminate world polio by the year 2005 (100 years of Rotary). So far more than 37 million doses of polio vaccine have been distributed in 13 countries. Two drops on the tongue and a child is immunized for life against polio. Before 1983 the Dominican Republic averaged 150 cases of polio each year. But there has not been a single case of polio since June, 1983. The reason: Polio Annual National Days of Immunization. One example of progress!
2. Africa is not the only area where hunger is a problem. In Bangladesh millions of people remain undernourished despite massive efforts. Two Rotary Foundation 3-H projects have positively affected living conditions in that country. A \$49,500 project has been completed and a \$486,000 project is in its first year. These projects are intended to develop self-sufficiency in agriculture, clean drinking water, fisheries for more protein, etc. Money well spent! Thousands of volunteers are active in these 3-H activities.

Last Friday, M.A.T. Caparas (president-elect of Rotary International) was a guest and speaker at Milwaukee Northwest. He is a labor attorney by profession. His Rotary club in the Philippines contains 419 members and he is a charter member. Rotary came to the Philippines in 1919 and there are presently 11,000 Rotarians there. Philippine clubs are strong on projects, especially the 3-H program. Doctors and dentists from his club, and others, go out periodically to treat people in areas that cannot afford treatment. There has been no polio there since 1980. Rotary is very prestigious in the Philippines.
