POLIO PLUS NOTES:

1. Tom Boers has agreed to serve as Area Coordinator for part of Area 5. Tom will be responsible for the Rotary Clubs of Thiensville-Mequon, Cedarburg-Grafton, and Port Washington.
2. As of April 8, the Polio Plus campaign had received more than \$18.1 million in gifts from all sources. The trustees have approved grants in 42 countries totaling \$37,415,000.
3. Germantown Rotary's Jump-a-Thon netted \$14,000 for Polio Plus; Waukesha Sunrise Club is raffling one week in a Mexican condo, and Kenosha is planning an art auction, all for the benefit of Polio Plus.
4. The clubs in District 627 have set a goal of \$687,000.
