PROGRAM:

Tom Boers introduced and narrated a slide program about the Ozaukee County Humane Society. He was assisted by Sam Decker, a volunteer in the program. Materials were passed out to elaborate on the presentation. Topics covered included: lost and found pet hotline, pet placement services, educational programs, pet therapy for nursing home residents, pet care resources available on request, referral services for special problems, spaying and neutering, foster care for animals, and emergency care by veterinarians. Plans call for funding an Ozaukee County Humane officer, and constructing "a Humane Society Shelter for Ozaukee County. We are the only county without one. Efforts are under way to raise \$250,000 for the project. Every penny raised goes to the project (nothing to fund raisers). Help would be appreciated.

BUSINESS MEETING:

1. The birthday can was circulated for May and June birthdays. The March-April birthday guys must have hidden it for a couple of months.
2. The financial report was presented by Treasurer Aaron Starobin. In round numbers, we have \$2,000 in the operating account and \$5,000 in savings. Bills are paid up-to-date, but there are a few accounts receivable.
3. Loyal Wells, Chairman, reported on the financial status of the T-M Rotary Foundation. There is \$35,810 in the fund.
4. The attendance contest has really stimulated attendance and makeups. We have had 220 makeups since the contest started. When these are paid off at \$4.00 each, the operating fund will get a jolt. President Johannes declared the Bolz team the winner. The Egelhoff team must pay for the first outdoor meeting for sure, and maybe for the second one, but there were some dissenters challenging payment for the second one. We'll see.
5. A new attendance contest starts next week. This will be a one-on-one contest with the loser paying \$20.00 which will go into the Polio Plus Fund.
6. Tom Boers described the Polio Plus program. R.I. has set a goal of \$120,000,000 to be raised for the eradication of polio and some other childhood diseases. T-M Rotary has set its goal at \$15,000, and various projects are planned.
7. Attention all Head Chefs!! Bill Ronzheimer has started a new voucher system for keeping track of bills for our summer meals. See him for your vouchers.
8. Changing of the Guard Party is June 30 at the Brown Deer Sheraton, starting at 6:30 p.m. Rotary Anns are included. The cost is \$18.00 per head. No meeting that noon.
9. Dick Berg passed out the Brat Fry tickets. Absentees had better get theirs before they are all gone. You can't sell them unless you have them.
