POLIO PLUS NOTES:

The United Kingdom has agreed to give one million pounds (\$1,538,000) to Polio Plus. The gift was announced on April 7th by Christopher Patten, Britain's Minister for Overseas Development. The United Kingdom and Canada are the first two governments to make Polio Plus gifts. The Canadian Public Health Association recently gave \$1,235,000 to Polio Plus for worldwide immunization of children.
