PROGRAM:

One of our own members, Pete Hiltgen, recounted his experiences as -a prisoner of war during WWII. There were 125,000 PW's during WWII. Pete was shot down over Austria and was the only survivor of his crew. He was put in Stalag I. We were given a vivid description of Nazi interrogation procedures and the barracks with 16 men in each room. All GI clothing was confiscated and PW clothing was handed out in its place, always in short supply.. Pete described the prison camp regimen, rules, barbed wire fencing,, armed guards, etc. He explained how they improvised and augmented their issue of one knife, one spoon and one cup.. They built or crafted many things to make life better in the prison camp. Much thought was given to ways of escape, and many secret tunnels were constructed. Ingenious methods were devised to dispose of the dirt. Tunnel workers had to work naked or dirty clothes would give them away. Over and over Pete described how wonderful is our freedom which we take for granted. It was a good lesson.

PROGRAM:

Connie Pukaite, Mayor of Mequon, and one of our own club members, spoke about her experiences as the Executive Director of Advocates for Retarded Citizens. She has been Director since 1976, with a total of 23 years in the organization. They have a paid staff of 11, plus about 500 volunteers. Her lecture described how mental retardation affects families, how people feel when such a child is born into the family, the trauma that results and continues. Her organization started 40 years ago to help such families. She pointed out that one in ten families has a retarded relative (a lifetime disability). About 90% are mildly retarded and these grow up, go to school, get job training, and go to work. About 8% are moderately retarded; most Downs Syndrome citizens fall in this category. About 3% are very retarded, needing 24 hour care. One of the biggest problems facing the retarded is how people treat them.

Connie went on to explain how ARC provides on-the-job training programs, classroom programs, and sheltered workshops. Her organization is a catalyst to show what can be done. Again, one of our own members gave one of our best programs.
