Pete Hatzinger introduced Jeff Brand, a 1975 Homestead graduate with a PH.D. in Economics, who spoke on the topic, "Gas Supply: What's In The Future?" He traced the history of the gas industry in the U.S.; and then outlined the story of regulation, deregulation, regulation, etc., with the consequences in terms of price, supply and demand. ATTENDANCE FOR MAY (now it is official):

The Governor's Monthly Attendance Report, as listed in his June Newsletter, shows T-M Rotary in undisputed first place with 100 for the month of May. We have finally edged out Slinger, although they are still first in the year-to-date rankings with a 98.8 percentage. T-M Rotary is 6th in year-to-date with 92%. We are one of six 90% clubs in the district for the year, with the month of June to go. There are 59 clubs, with one more in process. We received congratulations from the Governor for our 100 attendance in May.

PROGRAM:

Mike Holle introduced Peter Jushka, Administrator of MATC North Campus, who gave a combined narrative and slide presentation about the school. He described the academic, vocational and technical programs and courses; as well as presenting a profile of student enrollment, demographic information about the student body, placement opportunities, etc. Since classes began in the fall of 1976, over 63,000 students have been enrolled (full and part time). There is a full-time staff of 73, plus 177 part-time. We were also treated to a tour of the facilities.

POLIO PLUS FACTS AND DATA:

1. Rotary has exceeded its goal in the fight against polio by \$100,000,000. The total reported at the Philadelphia Convention was \$219,400,000.
2. The World Health Organization now believes that polio will be eradicated by the year 2000.
3. Our District 627, with an original share of \$580,835, has pledged over \$940,000 which is 162% of our share. That is an average per district member of \$248. Thirteen clubs have averaged over \$300 per member, including T-M Rotary at \$380, which places us ninth. Waukesha was first at \$905. T-M Rotary is 6th in total dollars (\$28,000); Milwaukee leads (\$97,600).
