Witliff explained that hockey was not new to Milwaukee, having started here in 1887 with the Schlitz Polo Club. In 1902 it was introduced into the Milwaukee School System. In 1918 a semi-pro team was organized by a Milwaukee filling station operator, and the Milwaukee Athletic Club organized a team in 1922 (which folded in 1926). Marquette University had hockey in the 1920's. The Milwaukee Chiefs played one year (1952), and another team was organized in 1958-59 which also folded. In 1970-71 the Milwaukee Admirals started up, playing an independent schedule. In 73-74 they joined a league, went bankrupt, and in 1976 they were purchased by the Petits.

Although we now have one of the best minor league hockey teams, the goal is to have a National Hockey League team. The NHL will be expanding its franchise. The Admirals are eager to :explain the game of hockey to schools and other groups, on programs, etc. They have contributed many dollars to the building of rinks in the area.
