TUESDAY, June 6, 1989 - Boder's-on-the-River

ANNOUNCEMENTS, NEWS AND NOTES:

PROGRAM:

Tom Martin, of the FBI, who is working out of the Green Bay office was the speaker. A graduate of Carroll College, he has been with the FBI for 17 years. For the past nine years he has worked with the Menomonie Indian Reservation. Tom stated that law enforcement today is greatly concerned with the drug problem, one way or another. He discussed the Drug Demand Reduction Program (a new emphasis) versus the curtailment of drug supplies. Curtailment of drug supply is not working, because authorities are unable to stop the drugs from coming into our country. Therefore, there is a recent emphasis on reducing the demand for drugs. Statistics for 1987-88 reveal that 81% of high school seniors have been involved with chemical abuse, which includes alcohol. Alcohol is a form of chemical abuse and still remains the greatest drug of choice. Illegal drugs is a 1.2 billion dollar business per year here in Wisconsin, which is more than we spend on our schools. The majority of crimes involve drugs, one way or another. Tom stated that in his work with the Menomonie Indian Reservation he had been involved in over 100 cases, and all but two involved drugs. Although the FBI personnel are not drug agents, they do get involved in the big cases. There are several federal agencies specifically charged with drug law enforcement. He concluded by telling us, (1) don't tolerate drug use any time, anyplace, (2) speak out against it, (3) support community groups that are fighting drugs, and (4) be a good role model for young people. Drug enforcement and coping is a community problem.
