John Riley introduced Wendy Barber who represented T-M Rotary two years ago as a Rotary Exchange Student to Brazil. She spent one full year there, living with one family during that time. She emphasized the value of such a program. Wendy showed slides, with narration of her experiences during her exchange year. She described the house and family with whom she lived: her school and the curriculum and subjects studied: her struggle to master a new language (Portuguese): stores, streets, public buildings, etc.: various churches, and more. She visited Brasilia, the capitol city, which is a thoroughly planned city. Also, she visited northeast Brazil where she observed different activities such as the fishing industry. Rio de Janeiro was on her itinerary as well. Wendy went into the Amazon. but only as far as tourists go. She described the inflation problem in Brazil, which ran about 30 percent per month and had climbed to 40 percent when she left Brazil. Finally, Wendy presented T-M Rotary with a Rotary flag from the city where she lived in Brazil. She did a nice job and we can be proud of our representative.
